

Visit the Abba Museum to learn all about the legendary
Swedish pop group

Le musée Abba **instructif** et **interactif** est un incontournable, à faire lors de votre visite de Stockholm.

The museum is devoted entirely to the famous Swedish disco group **ABBA**. You don't have to be a die-hard fan of the band to enjoy it to the full. There are **plenty of** unusual **activities** to make the visit a lot of fun.

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Abba, the band's history

A little history, **Abba** is a famous Swedish pop group, formed by 2 couples: Agnetha Fältskog and Björn Ulvaeus, then Anni-Frid Lyngstad and Benny Andersson.

The **name Abba** is an acronym formed from the initials of the 4 members. The band won the 1974 **Eurovision** Song Contest with **Waterloo**, a song sung in English, which was rare for a non-English-speaking band at the time.

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This success opened the door to an international market for **Abba**. The band then followed up with hits such as **Mama Mia** and **Dancing Queen, Gimme! Gimme! Gimme!**

Abba's success is also due to his **elaborate stage performances**, with increasingly eccentric, colorful and sequined **costumes**. The band quickly realized that its image was as important as its music, which was a forerunner in the **70s**.

The band went their separate ways in 1981, but they're still very much in the public eye. Then in 1999, the **musical Mamma Mia**, co-written with 3 members of the group, was a worldwide success. Followed by a **film** adaptation in 2008 starring **Meryl Streep**.

Where is the Abba Museum?

- December 24, 25 and 31 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.
- From December 26 to 30 the museum will be closed on Mondays

Course of your visit

What to see at the Abba Museum

The museum offers a **signposted route** with around 35 stages to follow. This made our visit much easier, as we were well guided. It's a truly interactive museum, with **screens** everywhere, fun activities, and even a unique device that lets you **sing** and **dance** along with the band members.

The reconstructions of the **various rooms** (recording studio, dressing rooms, costume workshop...) are full of realism and detail. In short, you'll never see the

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time go by.

We began our visit with a beautiful **film** tracing the **history** of Abba, featuring the biggest hits and the many performances around the world.

We then got to see **replicas of the vehicles** used by the group, and the rest of the tour focuses on the **history** of each member of the group, with photos and videos, and explanatory panels in English.

The next room, one of my favorites, is a recreation of the **music studio** where most of the band's songs were recorded. **Recording booths** with microphones are available for singing. It's not every day we get to sing in the studio, so now's the time to sing **Mama Mia** very, very loudly.

We then passed through several areas showing the life of the band, the **dressing rooms**, the **costume** workshop, an area with all the album **covers**, the **awards**...

Finally, the last part of the museum explains the reasons for the group's split, as well as the various works produced afterwards: the **musical Mama Mia**, the albums, the **film**....

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The part not to be missed

We recommend that you don't miss this **part of the museum**, as it's truly a unique experience.

We were able to get up on a stage with a **microphone** where we could sing and dance, accompanied by holograms of the Abba band member.

It's as if we were on stage with them, it's very realistic. If you want to laugh and have a good time, go for it!

We stayed about 2 hours. I was there with some girlfriends, we enjoyed the many activities on offer and had a really good time.

We loved the **atmosphere** inside the museum, with its subdued lighting and retro-disco decor.

We weren't all fans of the group, but as it's such an informative and entertaining museum, we all had a great time. It's a great idea for an indoor activity when it's raining or [winter in Stockholm](#)!

For easy access to the main points of interest, we recommend the **Norrmalm** district (today's city center) .
