Montenegro is a country of the **Balkans** to visit absolutely. This country is known for its beautiful **mountains**, its sumptuous **mouths of Kotor**, its **picturesque villages** and especially very beautiful **beaches with crystal clear waters!**

Here we reveal the **8 most beautiful beaches** in Montenegro during our stay.

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## Where to swim in Montenegro + map

**Montenegro** is bordered by a large and beautiful coastline, alternating **beaches of white sand or ash** and **pebble beaches**. Most of the beaches are equipped with

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sunbeds at low prices. Other more isolated and picturesque beaches are less frequented even in the peak tourist season. You are bound to find something you like!

### [The best accommodations in Montenegro](#)

#### **Kotor beach, Kotor**

The [Bay of Kotor](#) is located in a magnificent natural setting, offering truly picture-postcard landscapes. Good news, some coves are **equipped with deckchairs** and **the water is translucent**.

The one next to the old town is perfect for a refreshing swim in a heavenly environment. This is our favorite beach of the stay.

*Pebble beach, deckchair + parasol about 5€.*

Explore the Bay of Kotor and its caves by boat

If you'd like a **different view of the bay and its cliffs**, don't hesitate to book a [boat trip](#), lasting around 3 hours, which will take you through **several caves in the vicinity**, before taking a **dip** in the translucent waters **away from the crowds**. In short, an essential part of our trip!

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### **Murici beach, Lake Shkodra**

**Small secluded beach**, with **translucent** water, overlooking the beautiful lake Shkodra. The road to get there is narrow, so we advise you to be patient, as it's a heavenly spot that really deserves some effort.

## **Long beach - Velika plaza , Ulcinj**

Just a few kilometers from [Albania](#), this beach is 2 km long, and if you get as far away from the city as possible, you'll come to a less crowded stretch. In the distance, you'll see many **kit surfers** enjoying the beautiful waves.

*Ashen sand beaches, deckchair + parasol about 5€.*

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## **Jaz beach, Budva**

**Large beach** with **translucent water**, close to the [town of Budva](#) and therefore popular with tourists. On the left, facing the beach, you'll find non-privatized areas.

*Pebble beach, deckchair + parasol about 10€, parking 2€.*

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### **Valdanos beach, Ulcinj**

**Pretty cove** lined with olive trees, **crystal-clear** water. The cliffs in the distance offer a delightful setting. Some areas of the beach are not private.

*Pebble beach, deckchair + parasol about 6€.*

## **Mogren beach, Budva**

This **beautiful cove with crystal clear water** can be reached from **Budva on foot** in just a few minutes.

It is also very busy. In high season, we advise you to go at the end of the day, when the crowds thin out and you can enjoy the **sunset** over the town of Budva.

*Pebble beach, deckchair + parasol about 10€.*

## **Sveti Stefan, Budva**

This **almost island** is a must see for its incredible panorama. It should be noted that a good part of the island is **privatized** by the hotels. Take your time to snap a few photos, then take a dip in the clear water.

→ We recommend a visit to [St. Sava's Church](#) (approx. 5km away) for a beautiful view of the bay and Sveti Stefan beach. A beautiful moment of our stay.

*Sand beaches, deckchair + parasol 100€ (you can also sunbathe on the free part of the beach)*

## **Kamenovo beach (Budva)**

This beach, near Budva, offers a **beautiful panorama**. The water is very clear and clean. There are pleasant sunset **restaurants** and a **beach volleyball** court. In high season, the beach is very busy.

*Pebble beach, deckchair + parasol about 10€.*

## **The best months for swimming**

Obviously, the most interesting months are between **July and September**, with average water temperatures between **25 and 26 degrees**. The off-season also offers fine temperatures, with an average of **24 degrees** in **June** and **21 degrees** in **October**.
