



Citypass Stockholm: is it worth it?

When [visiting Stockholm](#), we recommend the **Go City Pass Stockholm**, which gives you free access to many museums, activities and some public transport.

To help you make sense of it all, we explain below how the pass works, where to buy it and, of course, our opinion.

What is the Stockholm Go City Pass?

The **Stockholm city pass** is very simple to use: your ticket gives you **free** access to many of Stockholm's museums, as well as to certain transport and activities [around Stockholm](#), including cruises to visit the archipelago. Simply present your

pass at the entrance to museums, buses and boats.

Note that **since the beginning of 2023**, most **free museums** have **become paying** museums, so the pass will help you save money during your stay. We were pleasantly surprised, as most of the museums we wanted to visit were included in the pass.

Here are just a few **examples of the museums and attractions** included in the pass:

- **Museums:** [Vasa ship museum](#), **Nobel** museum, [Skansen open-air museum](#), **Royal Palace**, photography museum...
- **Transportation:** Hop On Hop Off & City Sightseeing Stockholm **multi-stop** sightseeing buses take you directly to the sights of **Stockholm**. Please note that the public transport network (bus, metro, etc.) is not included in the pass.
- **Boats:** multi-stop tourist boats, for example to the Museum Island on Djurgården Island.
- **Activities:** kayak rental, SkyView, under-bridge cruises, [Stockholm archipelago](#) (summer and winter)...

You can opt for a 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5-day pass.

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How can I make the most of my Stockholm Go City pass?

The price of the pass is degressive according to the number of days, the most interesting in our opinion being the pass 2 (around 50€/day) or 3 days and more (around 40€/day).

→ Coût du **pass 3 jours** : 1 609 SEK (143€)

→ Coût total des **activités sans la carte** : 2 121 SEK (188€) soit une **économie de 45€ par personne**, de quoi s'offrir un bon restaurant ou un souvenir à ramener de Stockholm!

To get the most out of your pass, we also recommend that you visit at **least 2 museums** a day (or 3 museums on the same day, for example on Djurgården Island, which is next door), use the Hop On Hop Off buses/boats and do at least one activity (cruise, kayak...). We therefore advise you to prepare a **schedule**.

Where can I buy a Stockholm city pass?

It's very simple: you can buy your ticket directly online. It's a **digital ticket** you can download onto your phone.

The price **declines** according to the number of days, and you can opt for a 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5-day pass. A reduced rate applies to children aged 6 to 15.

Is public transport included?

Public transport (metro and bus) is not included in the Go city pass.

We advise you to use the multi-stop buses/boats, which are easily identifiable and will take you to the city's main tourist attractions and points of interest.

Stockholm city pass our opinion

We usually use this type of package when we travel to European cities. In Stockholm, if you're well organized, you'll easily get the most out of your pass.

As far as we're concerned, it's **saved us a lot of money** and kept our days full. If you're visiting [Stockholm in winter](#), there are plenty of museums to keep you warm.

Here are 3 final tips:

- When **planning** your stay, bear in mind that some museums close early (4 or 5 pm).
- Make good use of the **Hop On Hop Off buses and boats** to get around Stockholm, and you'll save on public transport journeys.
- **Cruises** operate differently from other activities, as you have to go to the ticket office in the morning to book your cruise. In very high season, there are very few places available. Even if you don't go on a cruise, you'll get a good return on your pass.

For easy access to the main points of interest, we recommend the **Norrmalm** district (today's city center) .
