The museum covers **many subjects**, such as **aerospace, transportation, climate, communication** and of course the **great inventions of Leonardo da Vinci**, with a detailed and complete explanation for each work.

With more than **15,000 works of art on display**, including the first locomotive in Italy, an airplane, a submarine, a huge boat... young and old alike will be amazed!

Leonardo da Vinci's love for science

Originally from the Tuscany region, he has been exploring the world around him since his early childhood. Then he became the apprentice of **Verrochio** (the famous Florentine painter), with whom he learned sculpture, drawing, painting...

Then he moved to Milan where he became a recognized painter and **engineer**, it is during this period that he painted the famous "Last Supper" on the walls of the refectory of the cloister Santa Maria delle Grazie. It is for him the moment to put into practice his **colossal work** on the representation of human emotions in painting.

He then painted the Mona Lisa, while continuing his scientific research on fauna, flora and the human body, including one of the most famous works "**Vitruvian Man**".

The main interest of this museum is the **gallery** dedicated to him. You will discover paintings, drawings and especially models of these different inventions, made from

his numerous technical drawings.

The Last Supper (1626), by Giovanni Mauro della Rovere, is exhibited as a tribute to the painter's masterpiece.
