

Visit Stockholm's City Hall (Stadshuset): the site of the Nobel Prize banquet and a great way to get a bird's eye view of the city.

When [visiting Stockholm](#), you won't want to miss the imposing red-brick **Stockholm City Hall**, recognizable from afar thanks to its tall square tower.

It's a must-do in Stockholm, as it's the venue for the **annual Nobel Prize banquet**, and from its 106-meter-high tower you can enjoy a beautiful view of the Swedish capital.

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Stockholm City Hall: Stadshuset

Stockholm City Hall (Stadshuset in Swedish) is located south of the Kungsholmen district. You won't want to miss its imposing red-brick façade and tall tower.

You can visit certain rooms on a guided tour in English or French (approx. 45 minutes - no individual tours).

At a height of 160 metres, the tower offers a panoramic view of the Swedish capital, and particularly of the Old Town (Gamla Stan).

Where is Stockholm City Hall located?

The **Town Hall** is located at the following address: Hantverkargatan 1, Sweden, on the island of Kungsholmen, a [Stockholm district](#) we recommend you visit.

Opening hours

The town hall can only be visited with a guide. Tours are conducted in Swedish and English.

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- Guided tour in English from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m., every hour and every day, except when closed.
- Access to the tower from May to September

Price for guided tour of the town hall

Tickets for the guided tour can be purchased on the day of your visit, at the Town Hall Boutique. The entrance to the town hall store is under the arch at Hantverkargatan 1. It is not possible to pre-book tickets for guided tours.

- Full price 140 SEK (€12)
- Student 120 SEK (€10)
- Children 7-19 years 60 SEK (5€) - (0-6 years free)

A visit to Stockholm City Hall is not included in the Go [CityPass Stockholm](#).

Tower prices

Access to the tower is possible from May to September for around €6 (free under 11) - partial access by elevator. This is one activity you won't be able to do in [Stockholm in winter](#).

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What to see during your visit to City Hall?

The Town Hall, built in the early 19th century, is a recent addition. To see it from the inside, you'll need a ticket for an organized guided tour.

For around 45 minutes, a guide will explain the building's history in English. You'll pass through various rooms, including the **council chamber**. In our opinion, the **Golden Hall**, site of the **annual Nobel Prize banquet**, is the most interesting room. The walls are decorated with gilded mosaics that are simply magnificent.

To find out more about the history and winners of the Nobel Prize, we recommend the [Nobel Museum](#) in Gamla Stan.

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Our opinion

During your visit to the [residential district of Kungsholmen](#), we recommend a closer look at **Stockholm's** imposing **City Hall**.

In our opinion, a visit to the interior of City Hall is not a must on a short stay in Stockholm. As far as the tower is concerned, the view over the **Gamla Stan district** is really nice, and we found the price affordable.
